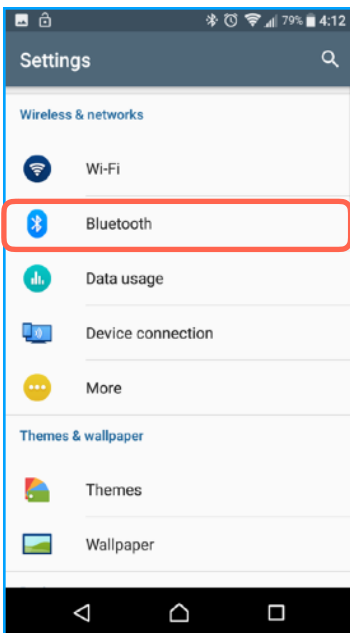


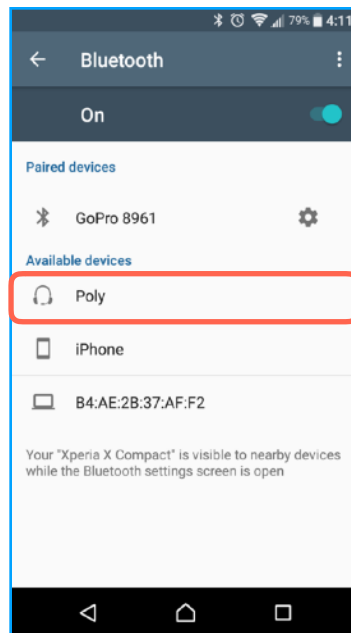
Attaching to the Poly with Bluetooth 1-1

Poly can accept Bluetooth connections from a Phone, Tablet or even a Computer. Once Poly has been connected to a WiFi network first it can then be found via Bluetooth on the device your using. Poly's P.status LED may blink blue during Bluetooth operation. When an iOS or Android device is connected to Poly with Bluetooth they can send any audio from the device to Poly. This includes apps like Tidal, Spotify, Pandora, and Youtube. The Micro SD card is not available for use with the Bluetooth Audio connection.

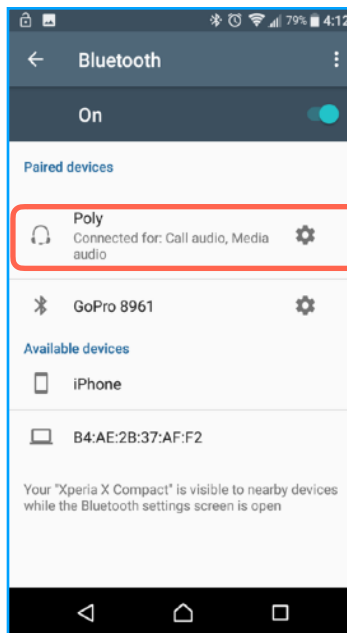
Android-Setup



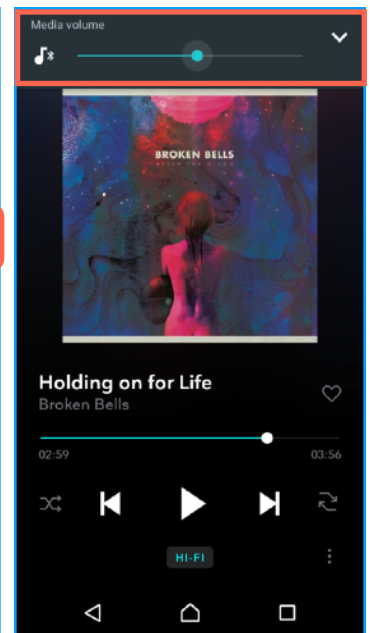
1. In Android settings tap on "Bluetooth"



2. Tap on "Poly" or the name you have given Poly.



3. Poly is now Connected via Bluetooth. Now any audio to will be sent out via Bluetooth to Poly. Some Android systems may ask for a passcode. It is four zero's (0000).



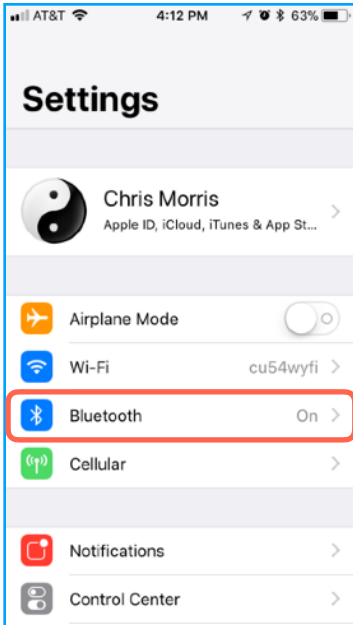
4. All audio will be sent to Bluetooth output unless headphones or a USB audio device is connected at the same time. For a working example the Tidal app is shown above with Bluetooth in the Media Volume Slider.

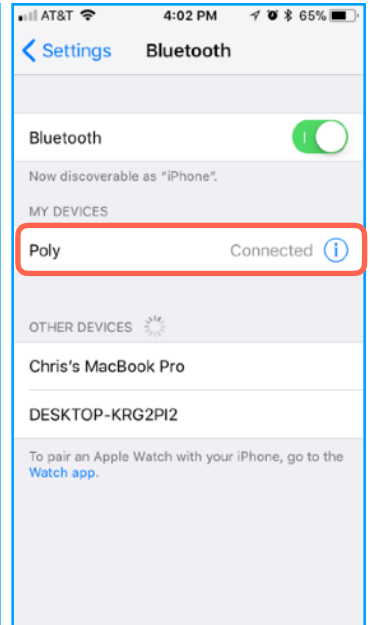
1. In iOS Settings tap on "Bluetooth".



2. Tap on "Poly" or the name you have given Poly.

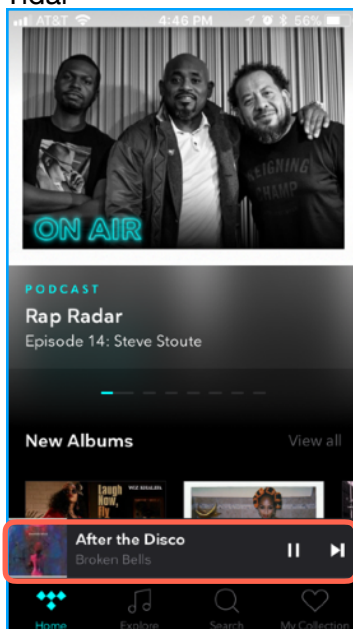


3. Enter in four zeros and tap "Pair".



4. Poly is now Connected via Bluetooth. You can now send any audio to Poly. See next set of images below for example using Tidal.

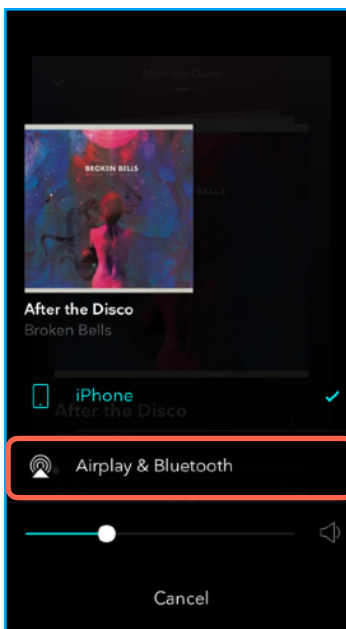

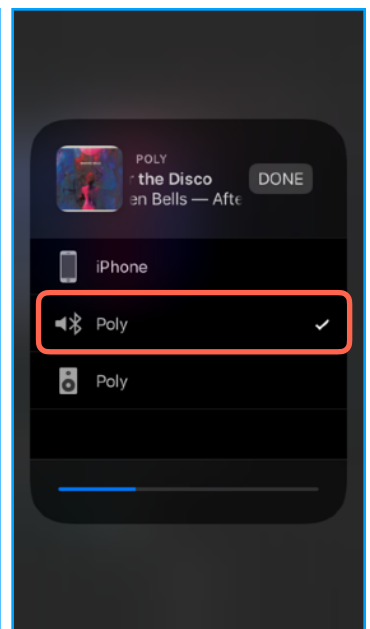
1. Find a song to play or tap on the "Now Playing" banner.



2. Tap on the "Airplay and Bluetooth" button.



3. Tap on "Airplay & Bluetooth".



4. Choose Poly or the name of your Poly next to the Bluetooth (B) Symbol.
